

1998 - 1999



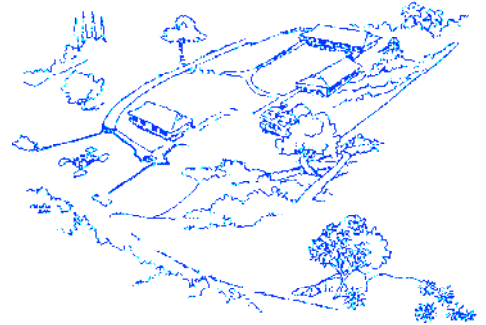

*Hualalai Academy was granted a six year accreditation from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges in the Spring of 1999.*

Excavation of the land began with the help of parents and community members providing in-kind services. Soon the driveway will be paved and foundations poured ready for buildings to emerge.

1999 - 2000

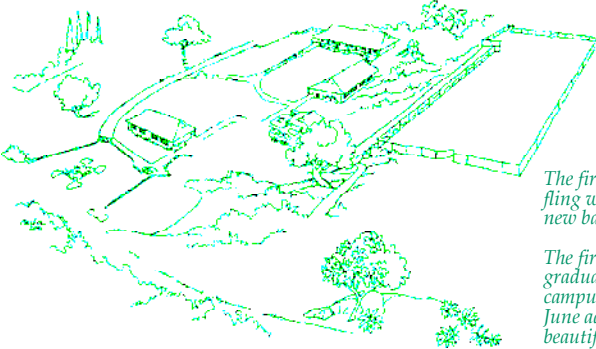


*It was a year of steady progress in spectacular school expansion. The year began with planning the move from the old campus to the new site with occupancy taking place in January 2000.*

*The first annual spring fling was held on the new ball field.*

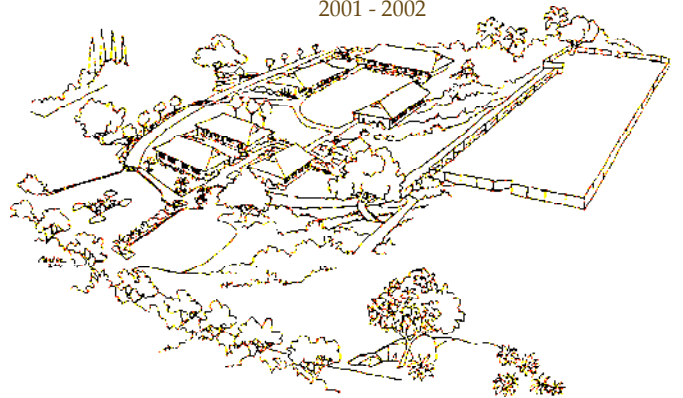
*The first 8th grade graduation on the new campus took place in June adorned by a beautiful sunset.*

*We amended our Special Use Permit to allow growth to 210 students at the campus.*

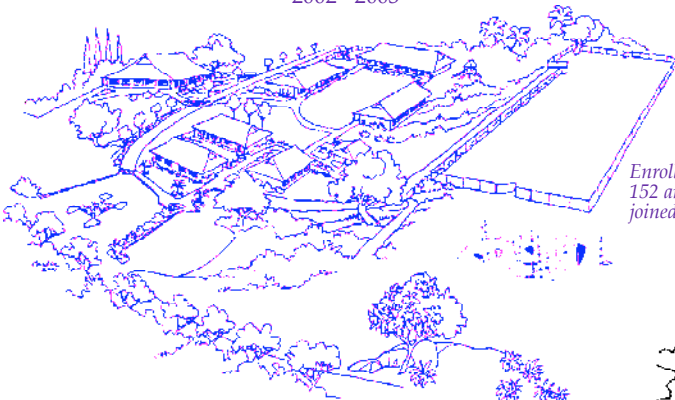
*A new middle school curriculum is launched and our first 9th grade class is admitted.*

Expanding enrollment increased the need for 3 additional buildings to be added. Landscaping continued with 25 ft. Monkeypod trees transported from Honaunau to 4 locations on campus.

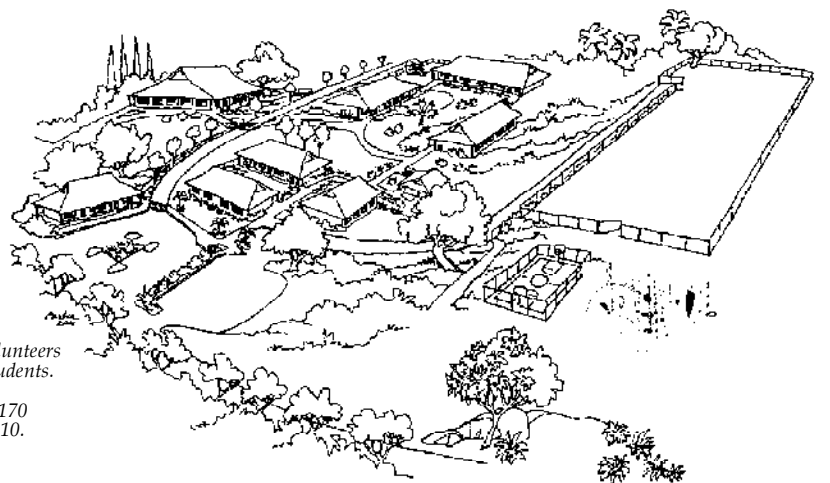
2002 - 2003



*Enrollment increased to 152 and new teachers joined the staff.*

In February 2003 the Bridge Building was completed providing the school with on campus assembly space. Working with staff, parents researched options for playground equipment and chose a state of the art play structure to the delight of our students.

2003 - 2004



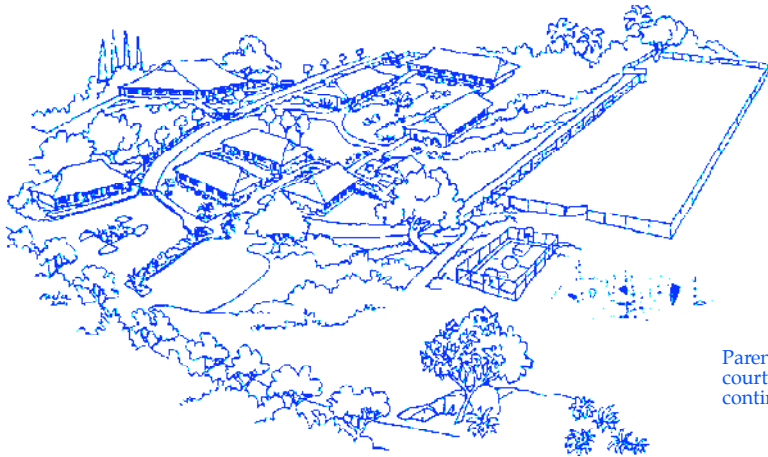
*Kona Bridge Club volunteers give lessons to our students.*

2004 - 2005



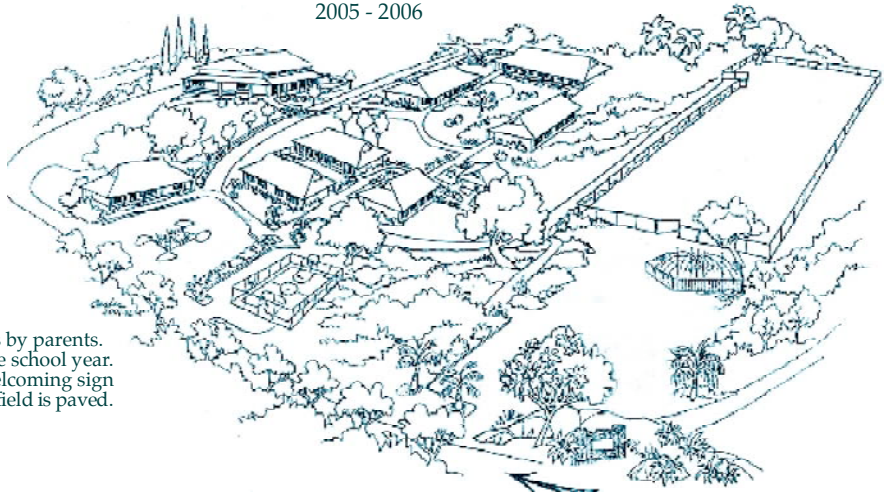
Enrollment grows to 205 students in grades K-11. The county grants an increase to the school's permit to allow 360 students on campus, up from 210.

The school is re-accredited with commendations in all of the areas examined and given recommendations of areas to work on over the next few years.

Technological improvements continue with the addition of 70 new e-Mac computers and 15 digital & video cameras.

Parent Debbie Kudo designs the school mascot, a Pueo, for the courtyard connecting lower and middle school. The campus continues to flourish with the generous help of volunteers.

2005 - 2006

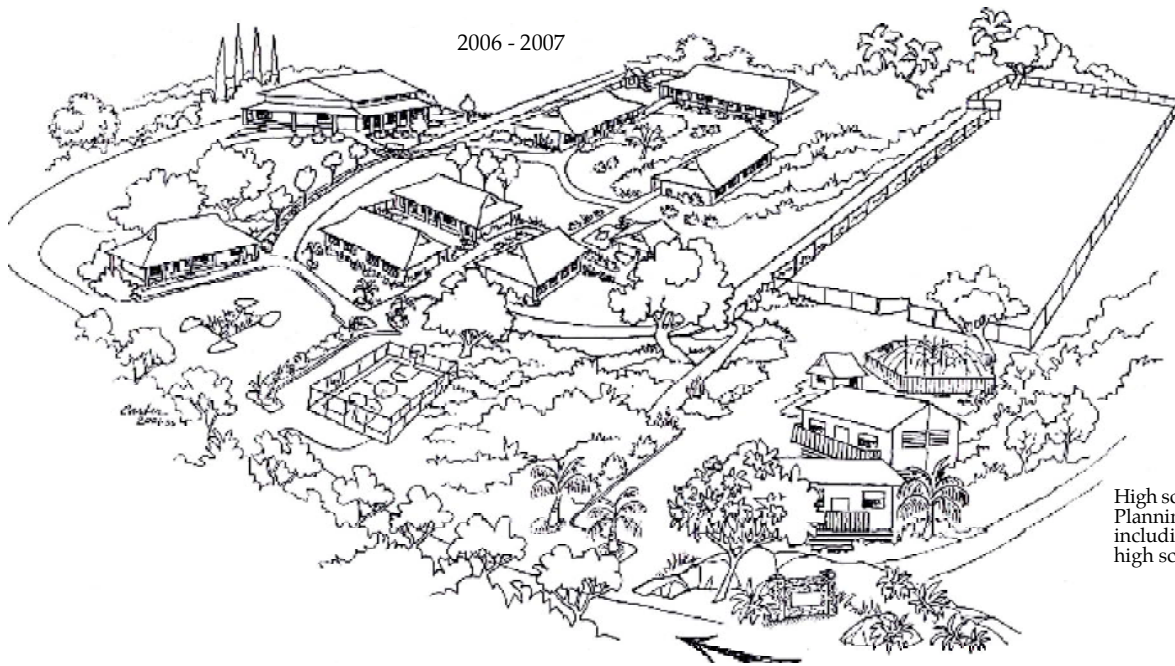


Enrollment increased to 240 students in grades K-12.

The first graduating senior class celebrated commencement exercises held at the Bridge Building.

The library receives new shelves thanks to in-kind donations by parents. Hundreds of new birthday books are donated throughout the school year. A second new school bus arrives on campus. A Pueo Post welcoming sign is installed. The hard-court is completed and a pathway to the field is paved.

2006 - 2007



A blessing & donor recognition event on campus marks completion of the \$4.6 Operation Education Capital Campaign, Phase I.

Palani Field, Macy Family Drive, the Twigg-Smith Hard-court, the Peacock-Vossen Family classroom, Kudo Courtyard, the Barbara Gans classroom, and the Bridge Building are dedicated.

High school classrooms are completed. Planning for Phase II of campus, including expanded facilities for the high school, is under way.
