

**TYPICAL COURSE OF STUDY**

Due to the small number of registered students school and the commitment to offer Honors as well as a regular College Preparatory course, students are combined in the two-year cycle of courses for the 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> Grade and the 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> Grade.
